Introduction

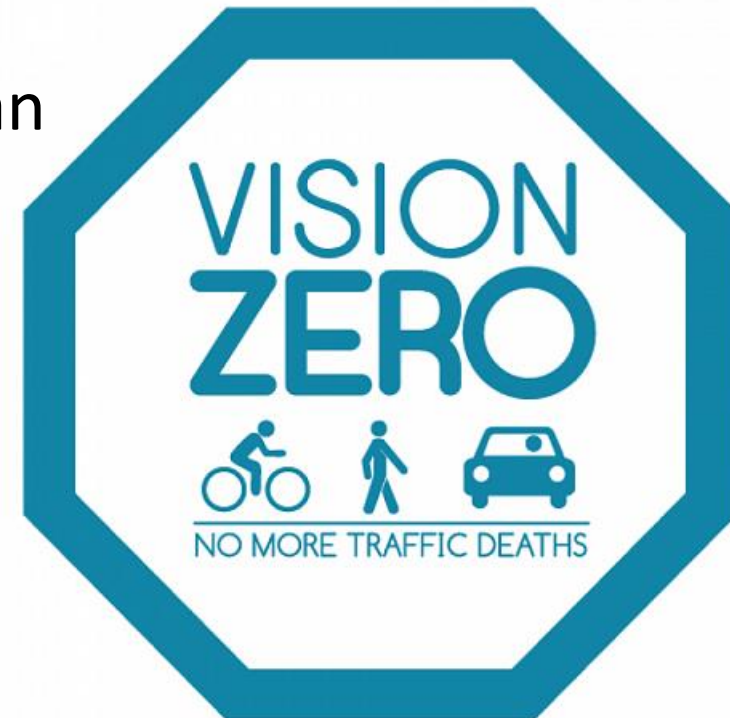
- The aim of this research is to apply situational crime prevention methods to improve road safety, with a particular focus on pedestrians, who are particularly vulnerable in traffic.

The Finnish model and Vision Zero

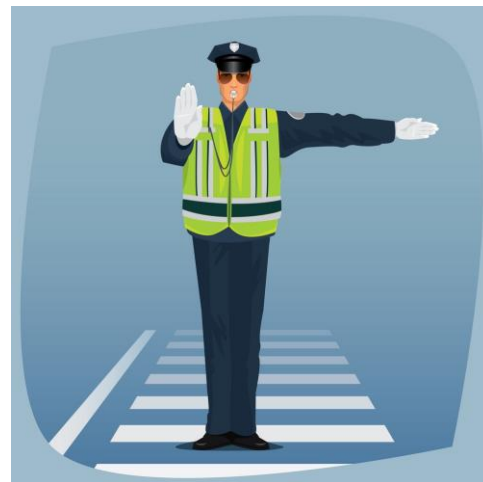
- The Finnish model, which applies the Vision Zero concept, provides an example of how to improve road safety.
- The analysis shows that road safety is a complex system that affects both human behaviour and environmental factors, and that situational crime prevention can be an effective method for improving road safety.





Results/Conclusion

- The success of the Finnish model is supported by lower speed limits, strict enforcement and public support.
- Vision Zero is spreading as a global movement and advocates for road safety to be treated as a public health issue.
